

Babblers



he town of Windham has long been crowned the "Gem of the Catskills." Superlative small-town charm and four-season offerings make it a perfect escape from the daily beat. Like the most precious of gems, recent renovations and upgrades to two iconic fixtures in this idyllic mountain town have this Catskills vacation destination looking simply brilliant.

INTO THE WYLD » THE WYLDER WINDHAM RESORT

As you roll into Windham heading west on Route 23, there's a short jog where the babbling waters of the Batavia Kill hug the road before sharply bending southward, wrapping around a campuslike cluster of seven pristinely preserved buildings. This eclectic collection of historic lodges make up the newly reimagined Wylder Windham resort.

Formerly the Thompson House Resort, this icon of Catskills hospitality first opened its doors in 1880, lovingly owned and operated by six generations of the Thompson family. When it came up for sale in 2021, it was immediately appreciated by hotelier John Flannigan, who owns the Wylder chain of hotels. He described his first visit to the resort and town of Windham as "love at first sight."

"I look for nostalgic, architecturally interesting, soulful, surprising locations with outdoor amenities that are built into the experience-not just a room and a restaurant," said Flannigan, whose other two Wylder properties are located in Hope Valley, CA, in the High Sierras and on Tilghman Island, MD, in the Chesapeake Bay.

"The property was just incredible. Seven lodges with 20 acres and a body of water meandering through it. It had incredible grounds and trees and architecture, and the views of the mountains are great," he crooned.

In just one year's time, the 110-room resort, with its architecturally distinct lodges, were renovated. Many of the building's historic touches were meticulously restored, much to the delight of long-time, returning guests. Every inch has been spruced with an eye for detail, comfort and good taste while effortlessly eschewing the air of pretension or try-hard chic that many of today's hotels manufacture. The interior and exterior decor have been curated with a nod to authenticity.

Flanigan aspired for Wylder Windham to be a place offering something for everyone. And he has succeeded by diffusing the resort with a laid-back energy and community-friendly vibe where "FOR ME, VISITING GREENE COUNTY IS A MUST DO AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR SINCE I FIRST VISITED 2 YEARS AGO. I LOVE THAT YOU CAN SET A PACE THAT WORKS FOR YOU. WHETHER YOU WANT TO BE ADVENTUROUS OR TAKE THINGS SLOW, BOTH OPTIONS ARE AVAILABLE TO YOU. AND BEING SURROUNDED BY THE BEAUTIFUL LANDSCAPES REALLY JUST DOES IT FOR ME!"

you can kick back on a porch or balcony, warm up by a fireplace while playing a game of backgammon, or wander the grounds that are dotted with "Wylder moment" opportunities. Tree swings, hammocks, two wood-fired saunas, fire pits, bocce, and a streamside pickleball court are just a few of the wonders. Add-ons, such as private pickleball clinics, a personal campfire with a bottle of wine and s'mores kits, and e-bike rentals with to-go picnic breakfasts cater to visitors' motivations to embrace the outdoor beauty of Windham.

Golfers can enjoy the proximity of Windham Country Club, which is open to non-members and borders Wylder. Skiers and snowboarders can catch a Wylderowned vintage Range Rover shuttle to Windham Mountain, which is just minutes away.

Not to be overlooked, the resort boasts a centrally located, downright large, in-ground, heated pool with inviting chaise lounges on each side.

Of the 110 amply-sized guest rooms, 84 have oversized balconies with views of the mountain, the stream, the golf green and the adjacent Windham Path–an ADA-compliant, 1.5-mile loop that winds through fields and woodlands.



Only 2.5 hours from New York City and 3 hours from Boston, Wylder Windham is for anyone from anywhere looking for an escape to a place of sublime beauty and four-season fun-be it for families, individuals, business groups or wedding parties.

The menu at the onsite Babblers Restaurant melds Wylder-style whimsy with mouth-watering throwback favorites, like a mac & cheese made with orecchiette and six-cheese bechamel and the option to decadently top with pulled pork, a "Wyldorf salad" with the classic fixings plus candied walnuts and lemon creme fraîche. Cheeky-titled menu items like "This Fish Ain't Farmed," "Not Your Mother's Meatloaf" and "A Legit Cheeseburger" underscore Flannigan's intention that the Babbler, like Wylder Windham itself, be fun, not fussy, and a place where tourists and locals alike rub shoulders and raise their glasses together.

With so much to offer and timeless panache, Wylder's charm is sure to draw back guests year after year-winter, spring, summer and fall. You might say Wylder Windham is made of the same magical elements that differentiate a rock from a gemstone: beauty, durability and rarity.

WINDHAM MOUNTAIN— WHERE FAMILY FUN IS #1

Rising majestically above the skyline of the picturesque town of Windham is Windham Mountain Resort, a yearround playground that has provided families with more than 60 years of vertical fun. This year, with more than \$9 million invested in improvements, Windham is looking to go "above and beyond" in providing memorable ski experiences for its patrons.

"It's a pretty exciting time. We've got a lot going on," said Chip Seamans, President and General Manager of Windham Mountain, which boasts 285 ski-able acres with 54 trails serviced by 11 lifts.

A recent improvement that anyone who has skied the mountain will at once notice is the addition of a third

detachable quad lift that replaces the fixed-grip triple at the mountain base. If you're new to skiing and don't know what that means, here's a quick translation: shorter lines, fewer crowds, and more time to ski.

The lift also provides better access up to and down from the mid-mountain Wheelhouse Mountain Lodge, a central eatery with breathtaking views.

A second new feature is the installation of a canopy over the "magic carpet" lift up the beginner slope. The overhead cover protects skiers from wintery weather and helps keep this uphill moving sidewalk operating reliably when the snowfall is abundant. Ultimately, the canopy is meant to make learning to ski less stressful, more fun and, yes, even magical.

A third facet of Windham Mountain's commitment to an elevated ski experience is something it takes seriouslycrowd control. Having switched over to online ticket reservations has allowed the ski resort to set limits on the number of people skiing the mountain each day. Windham is particularly known for its learn-to-ski program, and the resort's online reservation system is also making it both easy to reserve lessons as well as line up a time to get equipped.

"Your rentals will be waiting for you, and your instructor will be waiting for you," Seamans notes as an added advantage of the online reservation system. Yet again, it's a change that aligns with Windham Mountain's mission to improve the quality of the skier's experience (and keep the lines moving!).

Like many mountain resorts, Windham is proactively looking at ways it can minimize its environmental footprint and help to save winter. It has added 14 EV charging stations to its resort properties (12 on the mountain and two at Winwood Inn).

It has also invested in all tier-four and above snowmaking machines, which release fewer carbon emissions and have increased fuel efficiency. Newer, more efficient snow gun models also are helping the Mountain to improve upon the quality of snow being made and the efficiency by which is it being made. "We get more done in less time," says Seamans.

Windham Mountain has a longstanding reputation for being a family-friendly resort, and it's proving to be dedicated to preserving that.

"Our mission is to be 'above and beyond' with what we do and provide that quality experience, without crowds," says Seamans.

While best known for its winter thrills, Windham Mountain offers family friendly activities all throughout the year. Plan your next trip today!


FRIDAY »

e checked in at newly opened **Hotel Lilien** in Tannersville after an easy 2.5-hour drive from the city. Designed by Field Theory, the hotel is a restored 1890s estate that features 18 unique rooms, a full bar & restaurant, and an outdoor pool for the summertime. Each morning, guests can enjoy a thoughtfully curated complimentary breakfast served by the kindest hotel staff. I loved the various common spaces for lounging in comfort

when we had downtime (or the pool table when we felt a bit more competitive).

After settling into our room and exploring the property, we drove five minutes to downtown Tannersville for dinner at **Tabla**. This family-run spot serves creative small plates, many of which resemble the tapas dishes you would find in Spain. Standouts included the conservas platter and the albondigas.

SATURDAY »

Our morning started with a 25-minute drive to **Ambrosia Diner** for a classic brunch en route to downtown **Catskill**. Once we reached Catskill's Main Street, we took a stroll through the charming shops and galleries that are unique to the area:

- **Foreland** is a former 1800s mill that now houses contemporary art galleries, a collective workspace, and a coffee shop. It is located along the Catskill Creek for an impressive exterior view, too.
- **Catskill Chocolate Co.** will satisfy all your caffeine or sweets needs with its handmade treats.

- **Kaaterskill Market** offers sustainable and locallymade homewares and gifts. It is hard not to make a purchase here!
- **Magpie Bookshop** is a charming store that specialized in used or "nearly new" books.

After a relaxing morning we decided to take a short nature walk to **Riedlbauer Falls** in Round Top. The trail is a relatively flat 0.8-mile out and back route, so it's a great option for various skill levels.

Following our hike we explored more of the hilltop town of **Round Top** with happy hour at **Glen Falls House**.

The hotel is quirky but cozy and located perfectly for those looking for some outdoor adventure.

Dinner was at **The Stewart House** in Athens, a stunningly moody restaurant that serves farm-sourced dishes and locally distilled spirits. We were as impressed with the menu as we were with the hand-painted murals that covered the restaurant walls. I recommend the lamb chop and fried pickles!

We spent the remainder of the evening playing pool over cocktails back at **Hotel Lilien**. Stop by on Saturdays for a live DJ too!

SUNDAY »

It felt fitting to wake up to an endlessly rainy day on Sunday. We were sad to leave so soon! After our last continental breakfast at **Hotel Lilien**, we checked out and drove to downtown Tannersville for some shopping. The town has everything from retro eateries to both antique and modern shops.

- Shandaken Bake is a charming bakery serving coffee and decadent pastries. I recommend the chocolate banana bread!
- **Sundry** offers a lovely collection of home goods, apothecary items, and modern lifestyle essentials.

• Last Chance Antiques & Cheese Café is such a fun spot for drinks, charcuterie, and bar bites. We sat on the terrace here to enjoy the liveliness of Tannersville!

On your drive home, stop by **Circle W Market** for delicious sandwiches and a final grocery run. We loved discovering all these gems in the Great Northern Catskills of Greene County and already want to return in future seasons.



Whether you're looking to stroll historic river town's main streets for arts, culture and a bit of one-of-a-kind shopping or to hit upon authentic family adventures. **RIVER REGION** » TOWNS



The River Region's Main Streets Are Alive & Well

ommunities along the banks of the river are steeped in history yet abuzz today with reinvention. Among those you'll want to explore are: make this small town a charming weekend escape. The annual **Athens Street Festival** in July and **Victorian Stroll** in December exude the creative, communal, down-to-earth, family-friendly core of the town.

ATHENS »

This small, river town was once a bustling port for shipbuilding, brick making and ice harvesting on the Hudson River. Its eclectic blend of historic architectural styles and easy access to its waterfront, with views of the two-story brick and granite **Hudson-Athens Lighthouse**,

CATSKILL »

A trip to the Great Northern Catskills wouldn't be complete without a visit to the village of Catskill. With three breweries and a cidery, Catskill is the perfect starting point for a journey along the Catskills Beverage Trail. Main Street's



Victorian storefronts are made up of an eclectic variety of eateries, gift shops, boutiques, an independent bookstore and a record store.

Along the river's edge lies the **Thomas Cole House**, once home to the famous painter and founder of the **Hudson River School of Art**. The **Hudson River Skywalk** provides a six mile out-and-back pedestrian walkway connecting two national historic landmarks, the homes of Cole and artist Frederic Church's estate called **Olana**.

COXSACKIE »

Pronounced "cook-sock-ee," a name derived from an Algonquin Indian word meaning "Place of Owls" or "Cut Rocks," Coxsackie's village is located on the west bank of the Hudson River. A block in from the river is the Reed Street national historic district, which is worth exploring for both its architecture and string of independent shops, including a cafe and grocery store that specializes in NY-made foods, a wine and spirits shop, a specialty paper and home goods store and places to catch breakfast, lunch and dinner. Nearby the newly renovated **Coxsackie Riverside Park** provides space to relax, shop the farmer's market or launch motor boats, canoes and kayaks.

Take a walking tour of the **Bronck Museum**, a national historic landmark, which includes the Hudson Valley's oldest home, a thirteensided hay barn, several other historic dwellings and barns plus a fascinating glimpse into a wealthy family's life during the Colonial era. Genealogy and history buffs will also want to stop into the on-site **Vedder Research Library**.

Go on to "update" your own home with a one-of-a-kind treasure from the past at the **Coxsackie Antiques Center**, with wares from more than 100 antique dealers.

Did You Know?

The name "Catskill" is derived from "Kaaterskill" which means "Wildcat Creek" in Dutch. The original plot of land was sold by American Indians to Pieter Bronck in 1661 for 150 guilders in beaver pelts. The lower part of the village was once called "Reeds Landing". In the late 19th century, this area contained several factories and a steamboat landing, now replaced by a waterfront park.

Award-Winning Craft Breweries

he River Region is home to a growing number of microbreweries. **Crossroads Brewing Co.** serves its award-winning beer at two locations. Its original brewpub is located in the renovated **Brooks Opera House** in Athens, with 10 busy taps and awardwinning eats. **Crossroads' Taproom** in Catskill does not serve food, but food trucks are parked by the patio during the warmer months.

Rip Van Winkle Brewing Company in Catskill is the 2021 Gold Medal winner at the Great American Beer Festival for its Uncle Tito Mexican Lager. Stop in for award-winning brews and great Italian American cuisine. **Subversive Malting + Brewing**, also in Catskill, is a farmhouse brewery offering a perfectly paired pub menu of burgers and snacks for adults and kids. Subversive is one of the few breweries in the world that produces its own malts using the traditional method of floor malting. **Brewery Lahoff** is a New York State Farm Brewery offering hazy IPA and Tart Cherry brews, among others at their renovated barn location in the town of Climax. **Left Bank Ciders** makes smallbatch hard ciders and meads that reflect the



agricultural and ecological landscapes of the Hudson Valley and the Catskill Mountains. Left Bank hand-picks and forages as much fruit as possible and loves to support local farms, with 100% of ingredients coming from New York State.



Flowing With Fun

n summer, the river is a venue for adventure! Experience kayaking, paddleboarding and boating on the Hudson River. Boat launches and marinas provide easy access to the water for motorized boats.

In Athens, **Screaming Eagle Outdoor Adventures** offers kayak rentals (single and tandem) and paddleboard rentals, guided tours and sunrise and sunset paddles in conjunction with **Rip Van Winkle Adventure Guides**.

In Catskill, **Hop O'Nose Marina** and **Catskill Marina**, both full-service stations, offer showers, laundry, restrooms, a pool and a waterfront restaurant for dining. For a guided sailing experience, **Sail Hope Inc.** offers sailing and pontoon excursions. **Catskill Charters** offers full vessel rental options, from kayaks to pontoons and even yachts!

For a waterfall walk and breathtaking views, head to **Hannacroix Creek Preserve**, where 113 acres comprise four major trails, historic landmarks and the world's first recycled plastic bridge.

A breeding ground and nursery for American shad and bass, **RamsHorn-Livingston Sanctuary's** 480 acres make up the Hudson's largest tidal swamp forest. A haven for birdwatchers, explore its 3 miles of trails or join an Audubon naturalist on a guided paddle. Following a half-mile walk you can canoe or kayak from the tidal marsh out to the Hudson River.



History Along The Hudson

he town of Catskill is home to one of the most important cultural landmarks in New York State, the **Thomas Cole National Historic Site**. The picturesque home and grounds, which overlook both the river and the mountains, bear a distinctive place in America's art history. Cole, a British expat and artist who sailed up the Hudson in 1825 on an exploratory journey, is credited with founding America's first major art movement, known as the **Hudson River School of Arts**. He was so taken with the beauty of the landscape that his paintings took on an ethereal quality that enchanted gallery goers in New York and beyond.

Today, visitors to his former home can tour special exhibitions and learn more about Cole's impact on American art. The **Hudson River Skywalk** connects Cole's homestead with **Olana State Historic Site** across the river. Olana was the home of Frederick Church, Cole's first pupil. Discover the history of American art right here in the Great Northern Catskills of Greene County.

Art enthusiasts will find additional inspiration in Catskill at **Foreland**, a former Civil War era mill recently renovated to house contemporary art galleries, artist studios and event spaces as well as a yummy bakery café.

Built in 1874, the **Hudson-Athens Lighthouse** is an architectural landmark along the Hudson River—one of the remaining two lighthouses on the majestic river—it stands in the middle between the towns of Athens and Hudson. Constructed to guide vessels along the Hudson River and around a large mudflat that was grounding ships, the brick, two-story lighthouse was home to lightkeepers and their families up until the 1960s. Today, the lighthouse is open to visitors in the summer with tours that include boat transportation.

Family Fun In The River Region

xplore Bailiwick Ranch & Animal Park, where tigers, alligators and farm animals share 300 acres with the Koschitzki family. Find horseback riding opportunities and enjoy a night under the stars in one of Bailiwick's four rustic, Western-style canvas-covered wagons.

The **Old Game Farm**, a private zoo for 73 years, reinvented itself as an eclectic getaway with overnight accommodations, including the newly renovated Giraffe House, appropriately called the **Long Neck Inn**, as well as the property's mansion and glamping sites.



The **Hi-Way Drive-In** provides doublefeature flicks under the stars on not one but four screens. Book tee time at the **Catskill Golf Resort** in Catskill or **Rip Van Winkle Country Club** in Palenville.

A Vibrant Arts Community

he River Region is home to incredible performing arts venues. LUMBERYARD Center for Film and Performing Arts provides a residency program for performing artists and rents its more than 12,000 square foot space to film and television production companies. Located in Catskill by the Catskill Creek, LUMBERYARD also features performance events, such as outdoor circuses, magic shows, and art exhibits.

Foreland, an 85,000 square foot campus, situated on the banks of the Catskill Creek in Catskill, is home to contemporary art galleries, studios, food and beverage programs, special projects, and events.



On the opposite side of the Catskill Creek, **Bridge Street Theatre** offers theatre productions with sets and scores created by regional artists.




or anyone who embraces nature as a palliative tonic to the hectic pace of life but recoils at the idea of sleeping on the ground, may we suggest glamping?

Piaule Catskill: Your Next Relaxing Retreat

n the Great Northern Catskills of Greene County, nature defines the modus operandi of everyday life. Not only in the forever wild forests but in the bluestone-studded meadows where this landscape hotel is nestled.

After driving through winding and densely wooded roads, you'll arrive at **Piaule Catskill** located alongside stateprotected wetlands and a former bluestone rock quarry.

Guests can leave their cars at the hotel's entrance and make their way to the main house to pick up the keys to their home away from home. For a deeper immersion into the surrounding beauty, some visitors even choose to turn off their cell phones for the duration of their stay!

Because of Piaule's nature-first ethos, only 5 of the 50

acres were developed in order to keep the land as wild and undisturbed as possible. Here, visitors can unpack in one of the 24 stand-alone cabins or warm up at the double-sided fireplace located in the main house: where a mountain-chic lobby and locally sourced restaurant are perched above a temperature-controlled pool, cedar sauna, and restorative spa.

The lobby-like foyer resembles a modern New York State ski lodge with a Scandinavian twist and breathtaking views of the Catskill Mountains. Natural light pours through the floor-to-ceiling windows, and deep, burntorange couches beg for guests to sit and stay awhile.


A short hike away, the spa awaits. Here, visitors can de-stress amid treetop views and experience the healing power of time spent in nature's abundance. This peaceful

enclave offers a steam room, sauna, yoga studio, and treatment room where guests can opt for a massage or sound bath.

Just uphill from the spa, the Piaule restaurant is a sight for travelers' sore eyes! All the food served is sourced from local farms and purveyors. The long, communal tables encourage guests to clink drinks, break bread, and share stories.

Like the main house, the cabins invoke tranquil minimalism with their Japanese and Scandinavianinspired design. Each cabin is set on piers to allow the ground to breathe and minimize the impact on the pastoral landscape. In the same vein, lifting the cabins off the ground gives them a one-with-the-clouds effect, making each floating cabin feel like its own light-filled loft. These private spaces are equipped with handcrafted furniture, heated floors, organic linens, complimentary pour-over coffee stations, and a wall made entirely of glass that opens each cabin to the smells and sounds of The Great Northern Catskills.

From minimalist motifs and calming colors, to welcoming wide open spaces and intentional nods to nature—it's easy to see just how reverently considered each and every detail was in the creation of this modern escape.

Main Street Catskill is only a 10-minute drive away, the valley town of Cairo is just under 20 minutes and the mountain town of Hunter rings in at just around 30 mintues; but, with the company of a good book in cahoots with these panoramic views, you may find yourself just staying put.





hen Irish and German immigrants left their homes to travel across the ocean into New York City's harbors, they carried their heritage proudly into a new life. The city was their point of entry, but it was the lush, green rolling hills of the Catskill Mountains that felt like a home away from home. Settling into the Valley Region of the Great Northern Catskills of Greene County, this area became

known as the "Irish Alps." Irish country inns, bungalows and cultural art centers flourished and kept old-world traditions alive.

Sandwiched between the Mountain Region and River Region of the Great Northern Catskills, the valley area is known for its cultural attractions, miles of mountain biking trails and scenic beauty.

VALLEY REGION » TOWNS



ROUND TOP »

In the Bavarian enclave of **Round Top**, twisting roads run through towns like highland paths, and wayfinding signs are reminiscent of those you'd find on a trail in the Swiss Alps. This little pocket of the Catskills offers a European feel that can be seen in everything, from the architecture of the buildings to the dirndl and lederhosen wardrobes of waitstaff at German-themed restaurants. Many allinclusive Catskills family resorts are located in Round Top, as well as miles of mountain biking trails.

CAIRO »

Centrally located where NYS Routes 23, 32 and 145 converge, **Cairo** (pronounced CARE-oh) is considered the crossroads of Greene County. **Angelo Canna Town** **Park** is host to the **Greene County Youth Fair**, a four-day event that offers FREE admission and entertainment for families. Cairo is also home to the **Old Factory Brewing Company**, which serves up to 17 beers on tap in a renovated bottling plant on Main Street.

EAST DURHAM »

With its rolling green hills and verdant valleys, the small town of **East Durham** is rightfully renowned as the "Emerald Isle" of the Catskills. It became the adopted home of hundreds of families that emigrated from Ireland in the early 1900s, and its unique Irish cultural heritage continues to thrive. Find Irish-themed resorts and the **Donegal Irish Cottage**, a 200-year-old Irish cottage that made its own sea voyage to America, and more. East Durham also boasts the Catskills' #1 water park, **Zoom Flume**.







GREENVILLE »

The small, charming valley town of Greenville is big on offerings when it comes to all-inclusive, family-oriented resorts, including Sunny Hill Resort and Golf

Course, Baumann's Brookside, Pine Lake Manor, and Island Green Resort & Golf

Club. Set in a rural area south of Albany's Capital District, this northern Greene County town boasts expansive views of the Catskill Mountains to the south.



Motorcyclists: Come Tour The Great Northern Catskills

rom valley lows to mountain highs, the rural motorcycling routes that wind through Greene County are some of the best kept secrets around. Four designated motorcycle routes offer self-guided tour options for all riders. Take in some of the most scenic landscapes and iconic landmarks in the Great Northern Catskills from your bike. travels for 25 miles along routes 10 and 20, connecting to Cornwallville and Cunningham roads. The route curves a bit like the end of a cat's tail, giving the tour its name. For stunning vistas and smooth roads, this one is the cat's tail and pajamas!

1. The Cat's Tail Tour | 25 Miles

Created by the founders of the Hudson Valley Biker Network, this newest out-and-back motorcycle ride leaves from Blackthorne Resort in East Durham and

2. Emerald Isle Tour | 57.9 miles

Feel like you've crossed the border between New York and fairyland! The Emerald Isle Tour travels through the Irish settled countryside where you'll encounter smooth roads and rolling valley views from Leeds to Durham, East Durham and Prattsville. This route offers



motorcyclists the chance to experience Cochrane Road, one of the most scenic roads in Greene County that runs along the **Durham Valley Scenic Byway**. Navigate through twists and curves, enjoy the County Route 10 run and Prattsville run along the reservoir.

3. Mountain Clove Run | 73.3 miles

Traveling along the **Mountain Clove Scenic Byway**, you'll gain elevation and see the region's most iconic landmarks, including the Kaaterskill Clove, a deep gorge that cuts through a mountain range. Beginning at the Greene County Visitors Center in Leeds, you have two options for heading up into the mountains before looping back to Catskill. You'll travel from river to valley and valley to mountain with scenic pull-offs on Route 23A with asfar-as-the-eye-can-see views. Stretch your legs at the Mountain Top Arboretum in Tannersville or grab a bite to eat at one of the many restaurants downtown.

Roundtopia: A Mecca For Mountain Biking

ccording to the non-profit Round Top Mountain Bike Association, all trails included in the Roundtop Trail Network are on private land and operate on a 'handshake' agreement between the landowners and the association. The 20-mile trail network offers riders a unique ride-and-stay experience, as numerous trails run through lodging properties and border a couple of outdoor beer gardens. All trails are built by hand and groomed for fat bikes in the winter.

Riedlbauer's Resort is the main hub of the trail network. It hosts the New York State Mountain Bike State Championships in September. The Round Top Mountain Bike Association also hosts the Enduro

FUNdraiser and FatFest (weather permitting) at the Roundtopia Trail Network.

The Glen Falls trails are just across the road (and stream) from Riedlbauer's and accessible by crossing a 60-foot wooden bridge with miniature chainsaw-carved bears on its railings. There are three waterfalls on this property: Glen Falls, Bridal Veil and the Ice Box. The Winter Clove trails are divided into two sections. The lower section features a fishpond, a beautiful waterfall and a covered bridge as well as a gnarly single-track (Rolling Chunder) and a very steep incline and descent up the Mudslinger and down Cheap Thrill. For the daring riders, send it on the big downhill jump and around the high-speed sweeping left turn! The upper section has some steady climbs like the Lower Moonshine Ridge Trail and Switchback Hill, as well as techy downhill trails like Turnicut. Check out the Ledges for a great view at sunset and see if you can handle the g-forces in the bottom of the Hanging Valley.

Get Your Hygge On, Bavarian Style, At Crystal Brook Resort

ime travel is possible. Crystal Brook Resort and Mountain Brauhaus will transport you to an era when life seemed, well, simpler. The family-owned and operated Catskill mountain resort and adjacent German beer hall has been run by the Hasenkopf family since 1960.

The family's efforts to preserve its legacy provide an experience rooted in Bavarian culture that you may be hard-pressed to find these days, even in Germany.

But what truly takes you back in time is the gemütlich—a German-language word meant to describe a feeling of warmth, coziness, comfort and good cheer. (Yes, like the trending Danish term "hygge.")

You'll find gemütlich in the warmth conveyed by longtime hosts, Wendy and Eddie Hasenkopf, who took over running the resort from Eddie's parents. It's in Eddie's cooking, especially his specialty—an assortment of fresh, homemade desserts made daily. It's how Wendy, after all these years, seems to never forget a face—even those of guests who spent their childhood years at the resort and return decades later as adults.

It's in the finely calibrated giant leaps and slap sequences of the Schuhplattler, a traditional style of German folk dance which adult sons, Joseph and Robert Hasenkopf have mastered and will teach to any guest who is game.

It's in the old-fashioned, homey décor of the guest rooms. Clean, comfortable and not concerned with being boutique chic.

It's in the sound of families' and friends' chatter and laughter as they enjoy a board game on the outdoor picnic tables, cannonball into the generous-sized pool or return from a hike after discovering the enchanting



waterfall on the property and abutting trails, including "Roundtopia," which offers over 20 miles of some of the best mountain biking in the region. (Learn more about mountain biking on **pages 46 & 65**) And then there's the culture of camaraderie that spills over at the Mountain Brauhaus, a traditional German beer hall—serving lunch and dinner to the public. Long, thin biergarten-style tables with red and white checked table cloths establish a communal dining atmosphere. Colorful silk flowers and faux grapevine garlands as well as pennant banners frame the central wooden dance floor, where things are known to get good and lively as the evenings progress. The Brauhaus regularly features live music—think accordions, traditional polka and oompah riffs on crowd favorites, such as "Sweet Caroline."

Then there's the beer—or bier—served in half-liter pilsner glasses and 2-liter growlers that could easily be mistaken for a pitcher in size. There's no need to explain how that can contribute to the feeling of warm, cozy delight.

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

hen author Washington Irving first traveled to the Catskill Mountains, the small towns along the Hudson River sat at the edge of a vast wilderness. Superstitions loomed large among the dense hemlock forests and steep mountainsides. Irving would become known as the "Father of the American Ghost Story," setting the tales of Ichabod Crane and Rip Van Winkle amidst the still mysterious landscape of the Hudson Valley and Catskill Mountains. As area towns and villages grew, Irving's stories took root and became part of the region's history and allure.

All it takes to understand Irving's enchantment is a trip up Route 23A. There is a sense that, just beyond the next ridge, one might find the ghost of Henry Hudson in a small clearing, playing a game of ninepins while Rip Van Winkle looks on.

To this day the steeply sloped landscape beckons to those drawn to adventure and discovery. From soaring above the treetops on a zipline to hurtling down a mountain bike trails on knobby tires, the Mountain Region delivers incredible outdoor adventure and surprising arts and cultural opportunities.

HUNTER »

Hunter is Greene County's true mountain town. Nestled among the region's highest peaks, it is also home to some of the top attractions in the Great Northern Catskills. Every day is an adventure in this small town, home to a zip line tour, a mountain sky ride and a ski resort. Hunter is also host to seasonal events, cozy lodging and excellent restaurants.

Since the area was first settled in the early 1800's, tourism has been the lifeblood of the community. The rocky,

mountainous terrain and its stunning scenery attracted artists, poets, writers and wealthy travelers who wished to escape city life and draw inspiration from nature.

Today, tourists continue to flock to Hunter to enjoy the wild places of the Catskill Park and visit **Hunter Mountain Resort**, one of New York State's premier skiing destinations and home to **New York Zipline Canopy Tours**.

PRATTSVILLE »

The town of Prattsville is home to a legendary treasure that's literally hidden beneath a rock-**Pratt Rock**.

Tokened as "New York's Mount Rushmore," Pratt Rock is a rockface marked by a series of historic stone carvings depicting the life of Zadock Pratt, a congressman and prominent citizen from the 1800s. The rock became a memorial for Pratt's son, George W. Pratt, after he was killed in the Civil War, and is considered the first memorial for the Civil War.

It is a 3.1-mile round-trip climb to Pratt Rock--short but fairly steep (not especially suited for young children). The path ascends to the rockface, 500 feet above the road, bedecked with ornate carvings. The path also leads to a breathtaking view of the adjacent valley and creek flowing north.

TANNERSVILLE »

Tannersville is known as "The Painted Village in the Sky." Main Street is lined with hundred-year-old buildings painted bright and lively colors, eyecatching signs and decorative shutters. The small business district boasts a variety of boutique shops and antique stores. Tannersville's downtown is lined with exceptional spots for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Grab a bite to eat before or after catching a show at **The Orpheum Film and Performing Arts Center**.

WINDHAM »

SKIING »

With delicious local brews and dining specialties, relax and unwind after a day outdoors.



ZIPLINING »

Once the snow melts, new adventures spring to life in the mountain region.

Hunter Mountain is home to the New York Zipline Canopy Tours, one of the longest, fastest and highest zipline canopy tours in North America.

The **SkyRider Tour** is one of the longest ziplines in the world, soaring 600 feet above the ground with crisscrossing twin ziplines. Soar for 4.6 miles through the Catskills, from mountain peak to mountain peak and back again, reaching speeds of up to 50 miles per hour. Learn the necessary skills required to take the tour at **Zipline Pilot Training School**. The SkyRider Tour lasts three to four hours.

Located in the forest behind Hunter Mountain Resort's Base Lodge, the **Mid Mountain Tour** is perfect for families looking for a challenging adventure. It features six ziplines, four rope bridges, nine aerial tree platforms, and one exciting rappel. This tour takes about three hours and is family friendly.

HIKING »

For those who prefer exploring on terra firma, the Great Northern Catskills' Mountain Region offers amazing hikes. The Catskill Park is one of only two "Forever Wild" parks in New York State, and Greene County is home to most of the highest peaks in the Catskill Mountains.

At North-South Lake State

Campground, hike to the summit of Newman's Ledge, once home to the Catskill Mountain House, one of the 19th century's premier resorts. From this lofty height, peer across the lush Hudson River Valley, with views of Vermont, Connecticut, and Massachusetts.

The **Kaaterskill Rail Trail** starts by the former train depot at the **Mountain Top**

Discover Arts At Elevation

he Catskill Mountains have inspired generations of painters, poets, photographers and writers. So it's no surprise that the mountains remain alive with creative individuals and institutions.

The **Catskill Mountain Foundation** is a multi-arts organization that includes three centers. The **Orpheum Film & Performing Arts Center**, a 247-seat theater, offers weekly showings of Hollywood and Indie movies, as well as chamber music, dance performances, and concerts. **The Sugar Maples Center for the Creative Arts** provides studio art workshops in ceramics and more. The **Doctorow Center for the Arts** is home to the **Mountain Cinema**, a three-screen cinema showing mainstream, family, independent and foreign films.

Part of the Doctorow Center, the **Piano Performance Museum** is one of the world's only institutions dedicated to the preservation and exhibition of period pianos. See how these complex instruments evolved across Europe and the United States with pianos that span 400 years of history. The **Grazhda Music and Art Center of Greene County** was founded by a Ukrainian-born composer and musicologist. Its classical music summer concert series the oldest in the region—is held in Grazhda hall, a regional architectural landmark located in Jewett. It is part of the Ukrainian cultural complex built around **St. John the Baptist Ukrainian Catholic Church**, an immaculate wood-carved basilica constructed without the use of a single nail.

The **Mountain Top Historical Society** campus at the top of **Kaaterskill Clove** in Haines Falls is open year-round to the public. The campus boasts a fully restored 1913 train station, **Hudson River School Art Trail** interpretative display and scenic nature trails including the **Kaaterskill Rail Trail**.

The **Zadock Pratt Museum** offers a glimpse into the life of a Catskill founding father, and his years developing the tanning industry in the area as well as political career and industrialist leanings. The **Windham Centre Property Event Space**, located in the former 1826 Centre Presbyterian Church, hosts live events throughout the year.
